

OVERVIEW

This live educational webinar will examine recent advances in the treatment of both hypertension and the main hypertension-related clinical conditions, with a specific focus on coronary artery disease. Worldwide, hypertension is the most important cardiovascular risk factor and a leading cause of death. The prevalence of hypertension is set to increase despite global effort to counteract this rise. In 2018, the European Society of Hypertension (ESH)/European Society of Cardiology (ESC) Hypertension Guidelines highlighted an important part of the strategy to control hypertension, which is the primary role of combination therapy. As part of this webinar, we will explore the principles of combination treatment in hypertension and the recent availability of fixed dose formulations. In addition, the latest innovations in the treatment of hypertensive patients with coronary artery disease will be discussed. As these new developments should fundamentally change daily clinical practice and treatment of patients, we feel it is useful and informative to highlight the scientific evidence which supports these important changes.
